**BREXIT and Private Law in England and Europe**

On 23 June 2016, a referendum was held on the question whether the United Kingdom should remain a Member State of the European Union or leave the European Union. A slight majority of those voting in the referendum favoured a “BREXIT”. Much of the legal debate since has focused on the constitutional implications and on questions of European Union law. However, once the UK will have left the European Union, many further questions will arise. This lecture will explore the impact of BREXIT on English private law and European private law. It will also look at potential ramifications in international civil procedure, such as the recognition and enforcement of foreign judgments and what this will mean for choices of law and choices and forum in international commercial contracts.
